This month, we continue our series of brief and thought-provoking passages of Talmud. We begin, however, with a very popular contemporary notion: Summarize your Judaism in six words.

The book Six-Word Memoirs on Jewish Life continues a project first suggested in the online Smith Magazine in 2006 – the six-word memoir. The project pushes people to distill their life story, good advice, or even their company's mission down to exactly six words (you can read more at www.sixwordmemoirs.com). If you're skeptical, you're not alone – the cover of Six-Word Memoirs on Jewish Life asks, "Oy! Only six? Why not more?"

Some of the sentiments are beautiful:

"Leviticus: Love your neighbor as yourself."

"The Shema: My favorite six words."

"Do good. Be kind. Thank God."

"My people celebrate life every day."

Some are stereotypical:

"You never write, you never call."

"Family spends meals discussing other meals."

"Deli food always beats fine dining.

"Fourteen Rachels in my address book."

Some might be uncomfortable:


"Why worry? History suggests it's advisable."

"Non-Jewish wife more Jewish than me."

"But you don't look Jewish."

"A wandering Jew never says goodbye."

This was a project of Rabbi Simlai, a third-century Sage from the Land of Israel, who brought five different passages from the Tanakh that he felt summarize all of the 613 commandments – meaning that they summarize the whole of the Torah. (Babylonian Talmud, tractate Makkot, 23b-24a)

According to Rabbi Simlai, King David (who is traditionally understood as the author of the book of Psalms) summarized the Torah in Psalm 15, with eleven points. I invite you to look up Psalm 15 to see the list, and this passage in the Talmud (cited above) for the complete explication of the list.

Rabbi Simlai goes on to point out the verse Isaiah 33:15, which he says summarizes the Torah in six points. Again, the verse and the point-by-point interpretation of it are worth looking up.

Rabbi Simlai credits the prophet Micah with summarizing the Torah in three points: "...only to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." He credits Isaiah with summarizing the Torah in two points: ...observe justice and perform righteousness." Finally, he credits both the prophet Amos and the prophet Habakkuk with summarizing the Torah in one point. Amos said, "Seek Me and live," and Habakkuk said, "But the righteous person shall live by his faith."




