Dear Emanuel Family,

For three years the Jewish youth convention world has been silent. These weekends and sometimes longer gatherings are important for creating fun Jewish experiences, making lifelong friends, and developing a strong Jewish identity. For years, I have written about the magic generated at these Conventions and special Shabbatot. In the past few years several studies have been launched to quantify the impact of Jewish youth programs.

One study, conducted by Rosov Consulting, reached more than 25,000 young Jewish adults (18-30 years old). Most of the names were provided by Hillel International and 6 national Jewish youth organizations. The funders were especially interested in the social and emotional development, "how these programs impact them in their adult choices." One happy surprise: the number of participants that actually took the time to complete the survey.

- Respondents see social media as a mixed blessing, saying it can both create stress and be an outlet for stress, as well as connect with friends and help change the world. Their core Jewish friends often serve as a safety net.
- Most (81 percent) identify as Jewish (and 24 percent claim to be culturally Jewish), but many of those who say they have "no religion" also hope to engage with Judaism

at some point in the future.

- Many (63 percent) rank anti-Semitism as a problem for today's Jews, though few feel personally threatened.
- Most of the respondents (76 percent) report either a strong or very strong connection to Israel, with the majority of those who have not yet traveled hoping to do so one day.
- The study found those active in Jewish organizations (regardless of denomination or institution) flourish socially, emotionally, and spiritually as compared with those who are not. They also report feeling more connected to being Jewish, have higher self-esteem and better relationships with family, friends, and other adults, and feel empowered to make positive change in their world.
- Finally, the overwhelming majority (78 percent) are connected to their Jewish community (services, social justice initiatives, and Israel programming).

Our children are often the only Jewish students in their schools, and during the winter months, Jewish students feel even more isolated than other times of the year. This report offers clear insight into the importance of Jewish youth programs, in addition to the impact Hebrew School, summer camp, and families have on our children. These conventions are an important building block in our children's Jewish Identity. Sign your child(ren) up for the next Emanuel Synagogue Youth event, SWUSY Convention, and camp session.


