Bloom Family Hebrew School Educational Strategy for 2023-2024 Serving Our Children (0-16)

As our Hebrew School turns 100 years old this year, I wanted to lay out all of the educational offerings we have at EMANUEL SYNAGOGUE for our youngest members to set our legacy of LEARNING, SPIRITUALITY and COMMUNITY on a straight path towards the new century. We are thankful for the continued support of the Synagogue's leadership and the Bloom Fund in the central task of any Jewish Community, which is to provide for the education of its youth.

GAN SHABBAT / JUNIOR CONGREGATION (AGES 0-11)

This **free** program is open to all members of the Jewish Community. Enthusiastic Shabbat morning prayers full of music, dance, theater and community introduce our youngest learners to Hebrew, Liturgy, Jewish values and Spirituality in a safe and fun environment. The participants of Gan Shabbat and Junior Congregation practice their Hebrew, refresh their knowledge, and learn instinctively the importance of having a Jewish community.

Gan Shabbat (AGES 0-7) Our pre-literacy program relies very strongly on music and games. Come and starting learning the aleph bet with a prayer based movement experience. Very young learners will need adult supervision.

Junior Congregation (AGES 8-11) Introduces our youth to the traditional liturgy and gives our students their first chance to lead prayers in a

supportive environment of their peers.

Our programs run every shabbat from 10am-12pm. During many shabbatot we will be partnering with our **Youth Group** to extend the learning and fellowship into the afternoon.

BLOOM FAMILY HEBREW SCHOOL (AGES 3-13)

Learning from the best practices of other communities and assessing the changing needs of our community, we have decided to broaden the platforms in which our students learn to reach every child where they are, fostering individual learning, while preserving the beloved community that we have created in our wonderful classrooms. We will achieve this in three spaces:

1. WEDNESDAY HEBREW LAB (AGES 3-7)

Our traditional Wednesday slot (4:30-6:00 PM) will be reserved primarily for our youngest learners (3-6). Music, art, and age appropriate prayer and Torah learning will enrich our younger students and prepare them for Hebrew literacy.

Families who would rather their older students **tutor in-person**, may also make a weekly thirty-minute tutoring appointment on Wednesdays in the Emanuel Synagogue building.

2. WEEKDAY ONE-ON-ONE HEBREW TUTORING (AGES 8-13)

Starting at age 7, we will match our students with a Hebrew Tutor to work **one-on-one** on their Hebrew decoding, prayers, and eventually, bar/bat mitzvah preparation. In such a small school,

we have often struggled with great disparities in Hebrew skills, learning methods and strengths, while trying to foster communities of similarly aged peers. With the lion's share of Hebrew reading and decoding being done one-on-one, we can tailor that portion of the program to each student's needs. For your convenience, tutoring is offered both virtually and in person (on Wednesdays only). Our students will start with individual lessons of 30 minutes of tutoring, and increase it as our students near bar-mitzvah.

3. SUNDAY HEBREW SCHOOL (AGES 3-13)

Our traditional Sunday time slot (10AM-12PM) will be preserved for all ages so we can come together as a community to pray, cook, dance, learn, and celebrate. With the great success of our Jewish Enrichment Program last semester, we will be combining traditional frontal teaching in peer separated classrooms, with family programming, arts-integrated holiday prep, cooking, and even some field trips. We will also have regular Hebrew leveling activities (which will combine students by Hebrew level) which are key to retention of decoding and liturgy. As with our Gan Shabbat and Junior Congregation, we will be partnering many Sundays with **Youth Group** to extend the learning and the fun by scheduling events after Sunday School.

HEBREW HIGH SCHOOL (AGES 13-17)

Designed for our post b'nai-mitzvah crowd, Rabbi Jacobson will meet virtually with our Hebrew School graduates to examine a variety of topics in Jewish history, Thought, Holocaust, Israel, and more. This space will also serve as a forum for our Youth to grow into thoughtful Jewish Oklahomans and Americans, preparing them for the challenges and blessings of Jewish adulthood. For some topics, the class will be partnering with local, national, and international organizations to bring in outside speakers or participate in field trips and meetings with other organizations.

Please join me for a VIRTUAL INFORMATIONAL MEETING on Wednesday July 12th at 6:00 PM.

Looking forward to our second century of learning at Emanuel Synagogue.
