

At the 1936 Berlin Olympics, two American Jewish runners, Marty Glickman and Sam Stoller, were removed from the American 4 X 100 meter relay team. Even today, historians believe anti-Semitism was the motivating factor.

On January 19th, Emanuel Synagogue Youth will host one of the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday Coalition's High School study programs. This is the third year the chapter has been involved with the MLK celebrations. This year's theme is Gender, Race, Religion: Equality of the Olympics.

Barron Pierre de Coubertin, the founder of the modern Olympics, said; "May joy and good fellowship reign, and in this manner, may the Olympic Torch pursue its way through ages, increasing friendly understanding among nations, for the good of a humanity always more enthusiastic,



more courageous and more pure." Barron de Coubertin's global vision of bringing ALL Humankind together for this quadrennial event has changed but not waivered from his original vision.

Dr. King understood the importance of sport. He surrounded himself with athletes, and supported their struggles for equality and economic freedom. In 1967, Dr. King met with Tommie Smith, Lee Evans, and John Carlos to help organize the 1968 Olympic

> boycott by African American athletes. The athletes were vilified, and the raised fists of Carlos and Smith symbolized the athletes' struggles during the Medal Ceremony.

Understanding the power of the Olympic games on our continued pursuit for Civil Rights and Equality for all
